From the Vicarage

“Life is so unpredictable!” How many times have you heard that said?

Well the weather over the last two months has certainly been exceptional. So I wonder what August will bring.

Today, as I write this article for the magazine, the sun is shining brightly – as it seems to have done for months. Looking out of the vicarage window I see the grass has turned brown, the plants are struggling, the ground is solid and even the trees are losing some of their leaves. Birds frequent the bird bath for a drink, shelter in the shade of the trees or fan out their wings to cool down.

Yes, it is wonderful weather like this that means that we need a continual supply of liquid intake to quench our thirst and keep us cool. In this heat-wave it is sobering to think that our body is mainly made up of water!

Jesus must have known weather like this – the climate in Israel being that much hotter and drier.

Perhaps that is why he used physical thirst as an illustration of spiritual drought:

In John 7v37 Jesus said: “Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, rivers of living water shall flow from within them”

And to the Samaritan woman at the well Jesus said: “Everyone who drinks this (well) water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst” (John 4.13-14).

Perhaps every time we have a drink we need to remember Jesus’ words and seek spiritual refreshment from Him and from His Word – the Bible.

And as we pray for those who suffer from a drought of physical water we should also pray for ourselves that we do not suffer from a spiritual drought.

“Lord, give me this water”

There will be a Musical Evening in All Saints Church, Cawood on Saturday 8th September, commencing at 7.30pm.

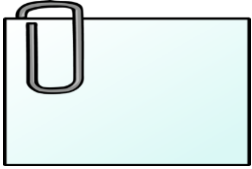
